

would love to be involved in.



Rotarians Tackle the Difficult

All that we do as Rotarians can create a lasting impact in those we serve. And Rotarians have never shied away from the difficult: Eliminating Polio, Creating a World of Peace, Helping those with Mental Health Issues. Serving the Homeless, and Bringing Awareness to Human Trafficking.

Mental Health: Russian River, Cloverdale, Healdsburg and Santa Rosa Rotary teamed up recently to hand out posters at community events that reduce the stigma of Mental Health.

Creating World Peace: Our District is leading the way with a Rotary World Peace Conference to be held this January 2025.

Serving the Homeless and Vulnerable: Sebastopol Sunrise has distributed 23,000 sandwiches partnering with a church and the food bank; many clubs have ongoing "backpack" programs which are packed with food and given weekly to families in need; others provide coats for the unhoused. Sonoma Mountain Twilight Rotarians partner with Unsheltered Friends Outreach to provide needed help.

Rotary History:

Our Challenging History in Germany

Did you know that Rotary Clubs faced significant challenges in Germany during the Nazi era? Initially, Rotary clubs "met with approval" by Nazi authorities, but this changed drastically over time.

In the early 1930s, Rotary members included Nazi Party members. However, by 1937, the Nazi regime started viewing Rotary as incompatible with its ideology. leading to severe restrictions and eventual dissolution of clubs.

Despite these hardships, Rotary's commitment to international understanding and humanitarian efforts prevailed. This period serves as a reminder of the importance of resilience and standing firm in the face of adversity. During WWII, Rotary clubs in Germany, Austria, Italy, Spain, and Japan were forced to disband. Despite the risks, many continued to meet informally and following the war's end, Rotary members joined together to rebuild their clubs and their countries.
